

# Legs 11 Lottery Winners

Show your fingers in a group of three — hit exactly 11 and celebrate like you just won the lottery.

## The core game

### How it works

- 1 Form groups of three and stand together.
- 2 Together, count down: 3, 2, 1 — everyone holds out any number of fingers on one hand at the same time.
- 3 Add up the total. If it equals exactly 11, your group celebrates as loud and joyfully as possible for at least 10 seconds.
- 4 Keep playing for two minutes. The group with the most 11s wins.

## Ways to play

### Two versions for every occasion

#### Way 1 — Classic Lottery

Best for 3–30 players · Anywhere

- Split into groups of exactly three players.
- Count down 3, 2, 1 and everyone holds out any number of fingers on one hand — no talking or signalling beforehand.
- Add the group's total. Hit 11 exactly? Celebrate wildly together for at least 10 seconds.
- Keep a tally of wins per group. Play for two minutes.
- The group with the most lottery wins is crowned champion.

#### Way 2 — Family Lottery

Best for 3–6 players · Dinner table or lounge

- Sit or stand together as a family group — play as one team against the clock.
- Nominate one person to count down: 3, 2, 1 — everyone throws out fingers simultaneously.
- If the total is 11, everyone does a 10-second family celebration dance or cheer.
- Set a timer for three minutes and count how many times you can hit 11 together.
- Try to beat your family record each time you play.

## TIP FOR PARENTS

### Try this at home

Encourage the most dramatic celebrations you can — jump up, scream, hug, do a dance. The sillier the celebration, the more your kids will want to keep playing to earn the next one.

## THE SCIENCE OF PLAY

### Why it works

The game works because it is genuinely unpredictable — no one can control the outcome, so every win feels like a real surprise. Shared surprise and celebration releases dopamine and builds team spirit fast, making it one of the quickest ways to bond a group of any age.
